Silence for Reflection

THE SECOND LESSON: 1 CORINTHIANS 15:1-8, 11

Now, brothers and sisters, I want you to remember the Gospel -the Good News- I brought to you. this Gospel that I proclaimed and that you made your own, on which you took your stand and by which your life has been saved. (assuming that your belief was the real thing and not a passing fad, that you truly believe and hold fast.) ³I passed on to you what I received, of which this was most important: that Christ died for our sins, exactly as Scriptures tell it; that he was buried and was raised to life on the third day as the

Scriptures say; and that he was seen by Peter, then by the twelve apostles, most of them still living (although a few have since died); that he then spent time with James and the rest of those he commissioned to represent him; and that he finally presented himself alive to *me*... So whether you heard it from me or from another, it's all the same: We spoke God's truth and you entrusted your lives.

On the first day of the week, at early dawn, the women came to the tomb, taking the burial spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, ⁷ that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. ¹⁰ Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed an nonsense, like an idle tale to the men, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves. Then he went home, amazed at what had happened
