## Morning Prayer in Ordinary Time Gathering

**DIALOG**O Lord, open my lips!

And my mouth shall declare your praise

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever, amen. Alleluia. Alleluia!

Give glory to God, our light and our life O come, let us praise our God!

Psalm 95

For our God is a great God and a ruler great above all gods.

One or more additional Psalms may be said, concluded with a Psalm Prayer. A time of silent reflection follows each Psalm and Prayer.

#### Word

One or more readings are offered. The reading of scripture is followed by silence for reflection, and each reading concludes with:

Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Other forms of reflection may also follow, such as brief commentary, meditation or teaching. The time of scripture and reflection conclude with:

We have been born anew through the living and abiding word of God.

The Canticle of Zachariah is read responsively.

Blessed are you, Lord, the God of Israel, you have come to your people and set them free. You have raised up for us a mighty Savior, born of the house of your servant David.

Through your holy prophets, you promised of old to save us from our enemies, from the hands of all who hate us.

to show mercy to our forebears, and to remember your holy covenant. This was the oath you swore to our ancestors Sarah and Abraham: to set us free from the hands of our enemies,

free to worship you without fear, holy and righteous before you, all the days of our life. In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us.

And you, O child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare the way,

#### to give God's people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins.

In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

especially the people and nation of Ukraine...

communities plagued by gun violence...

for all who work for peace and international harmony . . .

for all who strive to care for the earth as good stewards of your creation . . .

for the church of Jesus Christ in every land . . .

Hear us O God, for the deepest needs of our hearts, for the needs of our neighbors, community and world, as we bring them before you aloud in our own words,

or in the silence of our hearts... Here we may offer our prayers and petitions. The prayers conclude with the Collect of the Day and the Morning Collect.

The Collect of the Day is offered by the worship leader; we join in our hearts, then:

Almighty and everlasting God, you have brought us in safety to this new day. Preserve us with your mighty power, that we may not fall into sin, nor be overcome in adversity. In all we do, direct us to the fulfilling of your purpose; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
