THE FIRST LESSON is from the Acts of the Apostles, the 10th chapter.

²⁰ But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. ²¹ For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; ²² for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. ²³ But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. ²⁴ Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. ²⁵ For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. ²⁶ The last enemy to be destroyed is death. The Word of the Lord.

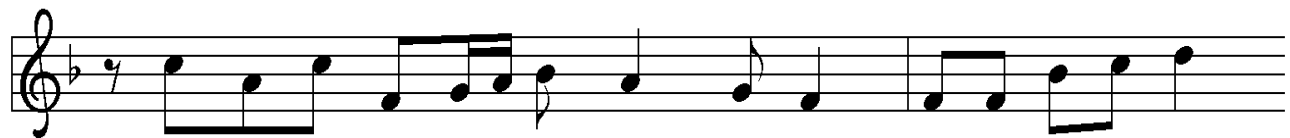

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

We share in the Lord's Body and Blood. We believe the risen Christ is truly present in the forms of bread and wine to forgive, renew and strengthen. You are welcome—this is the Lord's Table and He invites you! If you have taken an elements cup and prefer to commune where you are seated, please commune at any time after the invitation. The elements are offered with the words: 'The Body of Christ given for you' and 'The Blood of Christ shed for you'. The recipient may respond "Amen".

Those online are communed, followed by the musicians, those on the organ side and then the pulpit side. Please come forward by the center aisle and receive the Host

from Pastor, then move towards the side aisle to receive the Wine by intinction, dipping the Host into the cup, returning to the pew by the side aisle. Feel free to take your time coming forward. Following communion there is time for prayer and reflection as the altar is cleared and the chalice vested. Following communion and the hymns, please stand at Pastor's invitation.

The hymns during communion are #482, I Come with Joy and #481, Come to the Table.

BLESSINGS BY THE BOX – We will once again be helping local Tincum Elementary families facing food insecurity over the summer months by supplying them with Giant gift cards. We will be collecting donations through May 31st and gift cards will be distributed at the end of the school year in early June. Last year's families were most appreciative of this assistance. If you would like to help, please place your donations in an envelope and note that it's for Blessings by the Box.

BULLETIN/WEB SITE SPONSORS: You may sponsor the Sunday bulletin or the church website in honor or memory of a loved one and we'll list your gift in the bulletin as well as social media and our website. DID YOU KNOW... Many Thrivent policy holders are eligible to designate "Thrivent Choice Dollars" to a charity of their choice. Christ Lutheran Church is one of those options. We received \$1,337.00 through this program in 2025 and \$486.00 to date in 2026.

GIANT GIFT CARDS can be purchased after worship (see Cindy Carper or Kim Szymanowski) or during the week from the church office. Gift cards are available in \$5, \$10, \$25, \$50 & \$100 denominations. Checks should be made payable to Christ Lutheran Church. *(Gift cards may not be used to purchase other gift cards.)* Giant gives 5% back to the church for every card purchased. We raised \$2,600 in 2025 and \$1,000 to date in 2026.

THE LORD'S PANTRY has a continuing need for donations. During the month of April we are collecting canned fruit and baby food, but all types of canned/dry goods are welcome (tuna, peanut butter, condiments, etc.). Donations may be placed in the pantry cabinet by the parking lot doors or contact the church office to make drop off arrangements. You may also purchase Giant gift cards to be provided to The Lord's Pantry.

TABOR HOME SUPPORT – We have an ongoing collection of diapers (any size, except newborn) for Tabor Home. Diapers may be placed under the coat rack and will be delivered periodically to Tabor Home.
