READING: Genesis 1:1, 11–12, 29–31

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. There was a nothingness, a vast, watery chaotic emptiness, And God's Spirit moved like breath, like a bird above the watery abyss.

God said, "Let the earth produce every kind of living thing: livestock, crawling things, and wildlife." And that's what happened. ²⁵ God made every kind of wildlife, every kind of livestock, and every kind of creature that crawls on the ground or inhabits the water or sky. God saw how good it was. Then God said, "Let us make humanity in our image to resemble us so that they may take charge and care of the fish of the sea, the birds of the sky, the livestock, all the earth, and all the crawling things on earth."

God created humanity in God's own image, in the divine image God created them, male and female He created them.
