Psalm 23 is read responsively by verse.

¹The LORD is my shepherd;

I shall not want.

²The LORD makes me lie down in green pastures and leads me beside still waters.

³He restores my soul,

and leads me along right pathways for his name's sake.

⁴Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I shall fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.

⁵You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil, and my cup is running over.

⁶Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life,

and I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever.

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit;

as it was in the beginning is now and shall be for ever. Amen.

Word

Christ our passover has been sacrificed for us: so let us celebrate the feast, not with the old leaven of corruption and wickedness: but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth. The reading ends here. The reading ends here 1 Corinthians 5.7b, 8

¹¹ "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹² The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³ The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. ¹⁴ I am the good shepherd. I know my own, and my own know me, ¹⁵ just as the Father knows me, and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶ I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. ¹⁷ For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. ¹⁸ No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father." *John 10:11-18*

Following the readings there is a time of silence for reflection. The silence concludes:

Alleluia, alleluia! **Did our hearts not burn as He opened the Word to us! Alleluia, Alleluia.**

The Canticle of Zachariah is read responsively.

Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel; he has come to his people and set them free. *God has raised up for us a mighty savior, born of the house of his servant David.*

Through his holy prophets he promised of old that he would save us from our enemies, from the hands of all who hate us.*God promised to show mercy to our ancestors and to remember his holy covenant.*

This was the oath he swore to Sarah and Abraham: to set us free from the hands of our enemies, free to worship him without fear, holy and righteous in his sight all the days of our life.

You, my child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way, to give his people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins.

In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

God of peace,

by the blood of the eternal covenant you brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great shepherd of the sheep; make us perfect in every good work, and form in us that which is pleasing and good; through Jesus Christ to whom be glory for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Almighty and everlasting God, you have brought us in safety to this new day.

Preserve us with your mighty power,

that we may not fall into sin, nor be overcome in adversity.

In all we do, direct us to the fulfilling of your purpose;

through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
