Word

READINGS

One or more selections from scripture or other appropriate readings are proclaimed. Each reading may be concluded: The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

²Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation—³if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good.

⁴Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and ⁵like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁹... you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. ¹⁰Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy. (1 Peter 2:2-10)

[Jesus said to the disciples:] ¹"Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. ²In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? ³And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. ⁴And you know the way to the place where I am going." ⁵Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" ⁶Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. ⁷If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him." (John 14:1-14)

Following the readings there is a time of silence for reflection. The silence concludes: You have been born anew through the living and abiding word of God.

The Canticle of Zachariah is read responsively.

Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel; God has come to his people and set them free. *God has raised up for us a mighty savior, born of the house of his servant David.*

Through his holy prophets he promised of old

that he would save us from our enemies, from the hands of all who hate us.

God promised to show mercy to our ancestors and to remember his holy covenant.

This was the oath he swore to Sarah and Abraham:

to set us free from the hands of our enemies,

free to worship him without fear,

holy and righteous in his sight all the days of our life.

You, my child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way, to give his people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins. In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death,

and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

In Christ is healing and life, wholeness and salvation: let us bring the needs of our lives, our neighbors and our community to God.

Almighty Father,

you have given your only Son to die for our sins

and to rise again for our justification:

grant us so to put away the leaven of malice and wickedness

that we may always serve you in pureness of living and truth;

through the merits of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Amen.

Almighty and everlasting God, you have brought us in safety to this new day. Preserve us with your mighty power,

that we may not fall into sin, nor be overcome in adversity.

In all we do, direct us to the fulfilling of your purpose;

through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.
